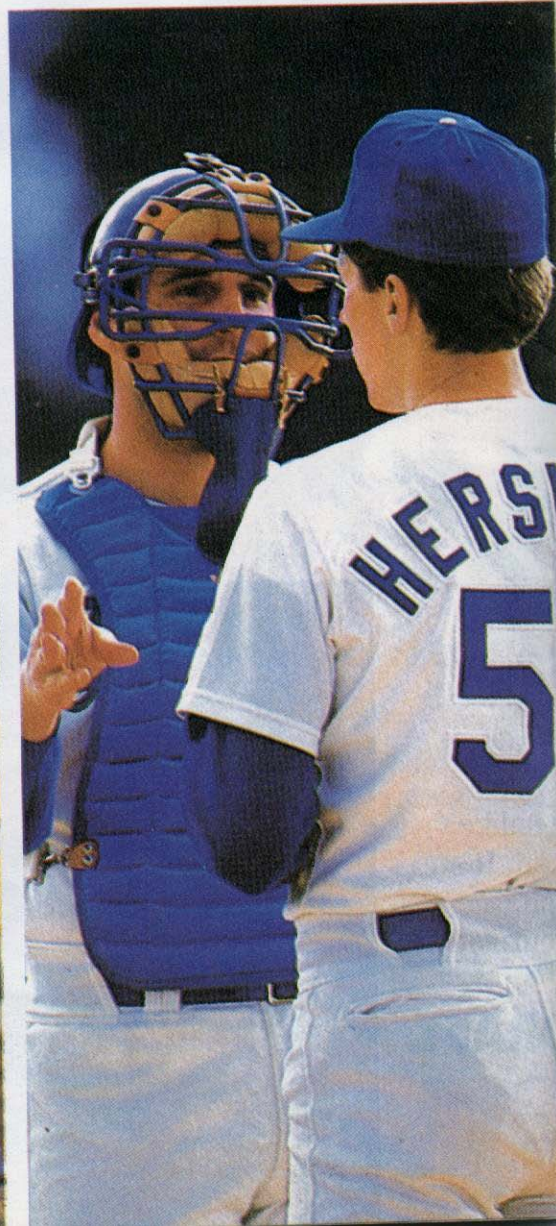
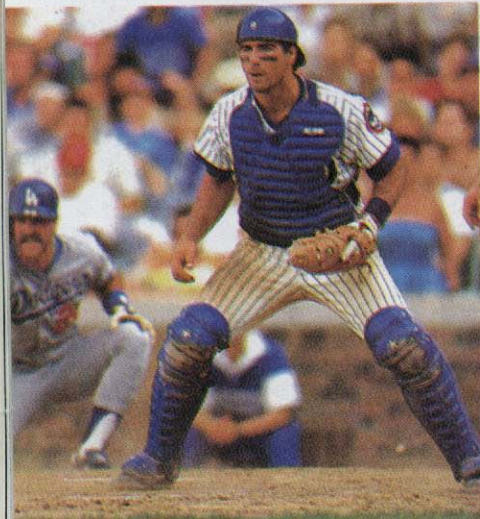
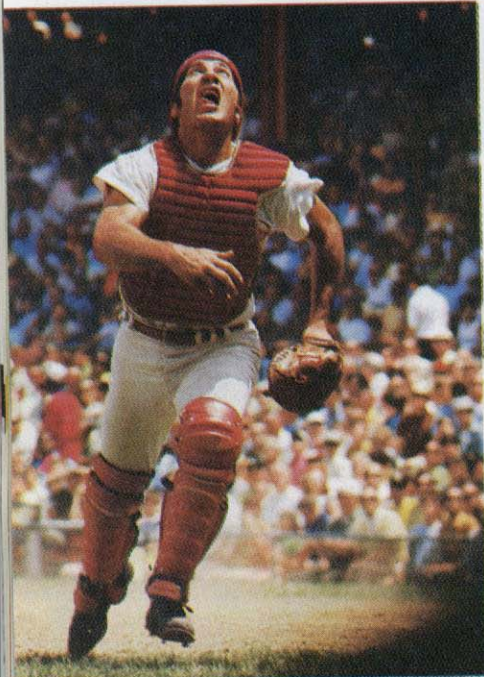


## High Light
